Introduction

THE COLLEGE

PBC, established in 1928, is an interdenominational evangelical Bible College which maintains a fine tradition of training men and women for ministry. PBC has had several homes over the years. Early premises were rented in and around Mt. Lawley. In September 1934, the College moved into buildings on its own land in Joondanna. From February 1951 until July 1986, it was located at Mt. Lawley, and since then has been at the current Karrinyup campus. The current campus has outstanding facilities, including excellent accommodation on site.

PBC is an approved private Higher Education provider and all of the College's courses in this prospectus are fully government accredited, and therefore, all students who are Australian citizens can access FEE-HELP and full-time students may be eligible for Austudy. PBC is also a participating member of the South Pacific Association of Bible Colleges. This has the advantage that all PBC courses are internationally recognised by evangelical and para-church agencies, guaranteeing further career opportunities for students.

Why study theology?

That you are reading this prospectus implies that you are seriously considering studying theology. People choose to study theology for a variety of reasons. Some commence their studies purely as a means to an end; they feel called by God to minister in the church or on the mission field and they see theological studies as a necessary step towards achieving that goal. Others start their theological studies in the hope of finding answers to a variety of personal questions concerning God, the world, other people, and themselves. They may seek religious certainty and more in-depth theoretical

knowledge of the faith they profess. Still others are more interested in acquiring practical skills rather than theoretical knowledge.

The reasons why we embark on theological studies may not necessarily determine what one might receive from such a venture, because God has his own priorities for those who set out to learn more about him.

Strange Knowledge

Theological knowledge is a strange kind of knowledge. It is theoretical because it deals primarily with words and ideas rather than material objects. Theological knowledge is also 'spiritual knowledge' because the Holy Spirit uses theological reflection to challenge and change our deepest thoughts and attitudes. One theologian was known to say that theology is the way in which we love God with our minds.

Theological knowledge is, however, also practical. It is concerned with the God who has entered our material existence to transform it for the better. Theological knowledge invites us to trust God more as we commit to doing the impossible in his name. Theological knowledge wants to make us uncomfortable with the way things are because we have become aware of how Jesus has renewed and continues to renew our broken reality. Theology turns believers to the future, filling them with hope for what can be because of what Jesus has done.

Theological knowledge calls us to become active citizens in God's Kingdom of love in this world.

Theological knowledge that does not bring us to love God and other people more is never genuine theological knowledge. Similarly, our sessional lecturer, Dr David Shaw, often begins his classes by saying: 'If you do not love God and your neighbours more by the end of these lectures, the chances are that I have not done my job well'.

PBC is ready to accompany you as you set out on your own theological journey. Our faculty are all Bible-believing Christians who are equipped to guide you as we explore together the richness of God's revelation. The journey may be a little bit scary at times, but it is also exhilarating and wonderfully rewarding. But that is to be expected as one journeys with the God of love whose upside-down kingdom will eventually turn all things right-side-up again.

WE ARE COMMUNICATION FOCUSED

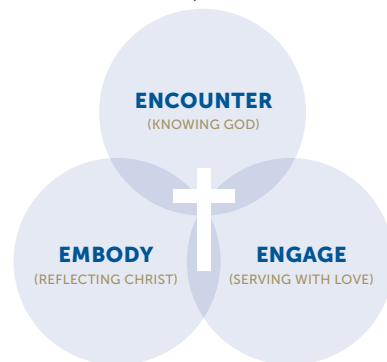

Our Strengths

UNDERGRADUATE CERTIFICATES

Provider Code: 00986G

The undergraduate certificates are catered to students who are seeking to develop their knowledge and skillset in specific areas or wish to begin the journey of studying but prefer to ease into it slowly. The following undergraduate certificates can be undertaken as a smaller qualification or nested into a larger programme of study upon completion. Students can study an undergraduate certificate in counselling, pastoral counselling, ministry or biblical studies.

DIPLOMA OF MINISTRY

CRICOS Course Code: 061404G CRICOS Provider Code: 00986G

The Diploma of Ministry is equivalent to one year of full-time study. The Diploma is designed to develop foundational Biblical knowledge, basic communication skills and character development.

ADVANCED DIPLOMA OF MINISTRY

CRICOS Course Code: 051855G CRICOS Provider Code: 00986G

This Advanced Diploma is structured to provide students with the necessary practical skills and a solid Biblical grounding so they are equipped to lead a life of Christian service. The course is equal to 2 years of the 3 year degree.

BACHELOR OF MINISTRY

CRICOS Course Code: 051857F CRICOS Provider Code: 00986G

This Degree reflects the core intention of PBC. It provides a rich academic and practically integrated program that equips students for a lifetime of ministry and effectively equips Christians in a church or ministry context for service.

BACHELOR OF COUNSELLING *ACCS

CRICOS Course Code: 0101040 CRICOS Provider Code: PRV12047

The Bachelor of Social Science – in Counselling is an ACA registered qualification enabling students with the flexibility to become professionally registered counsellors or pastoral counsellors in a church setting. This course integrates biblical theology, psychology and counselling theories and practices, enabling students to confidently facilitate the transformation of their clients by enabling clients to work through their challenging life issues.

GRADUATE DIPLOMA OF MINISTRY

CRICOS Course Code: 061405G CRICOS Provider Code: 00986G

This Graduate Diploma is designed to enable students who already have a Bachelor Degree in another field to study at postgraduate level and to gain a basic understanding of the Bible and key theological themes as well as develop communication skills for Christian service. This course allows for students to also specialise in specific areas to suit their vocational or ministry needs.

MASTER OF ARTS *SCD

CRICOS Course Code: 063708J CRICOS Provider Code: 03284C

The Master of Arts course is designed for those who hold a tertiary qualification in a theological discipline, who wish to pursue a graduate qualification in theology, and who are seeking skills in theological studies to enhance their professional work. Equivalent to 18 months of the Master of Divinity course.

MASTER OF DIVINITY *SCD

A graduate entry program for students with a previous non-theological degree seeking to undertake their initial theological studies. It is a comprehensive degree leading to Christian Ministry or graduate research study in theology at the highest level.

MASTER OF THEOLOGY *SCD

An advanced graduate program in theology and related disciplines for candidates with a prior three year theological degree and who seek to further specialise in theological studies or pursue research in the future.

UNDERGRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN PASTORAL COUNSELLING

The Undergraduate Certificate in Ministry provides students with a foundational knowledge of the bible and theology within their specific ministry context.

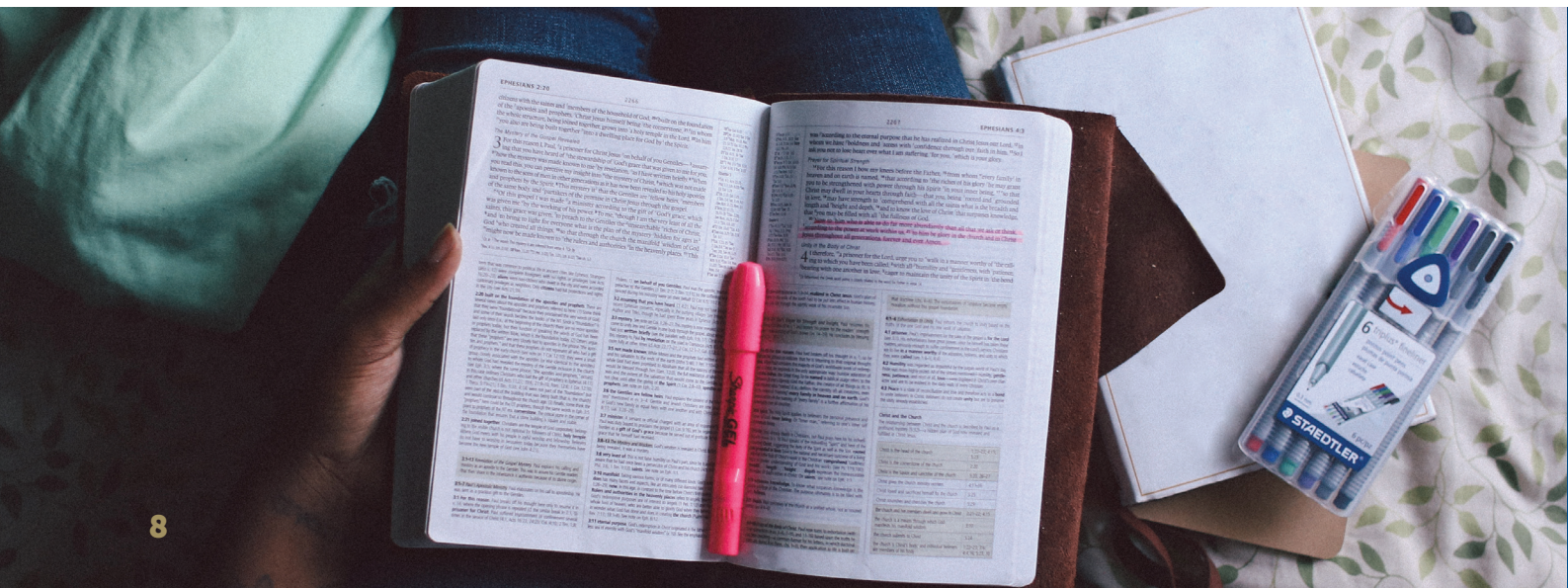

The course has a solid biblical core with the flexibility of choosing a number of specialised practical subjects. Students who graduate from the course will be more confident and excited about their faith and be able to communicate it in whatever context God may be leading them. The Diploma of Ministry is ideal as a gap year plan, as an internship program, as a year out for personal growth, or for those seeking to be involved in ministry.

COURSE DURATION AND STRUCTURE

The course is 1 year full time and a maximum of 4 years part-time. The course structure is based on two semesters (each 15 week duration), with four units taught in each semester. It comprises 4 core units and 4 ministry units. Each unit carries 3 credit points and graduates require a total of 24 credit points to successfully complete the course. 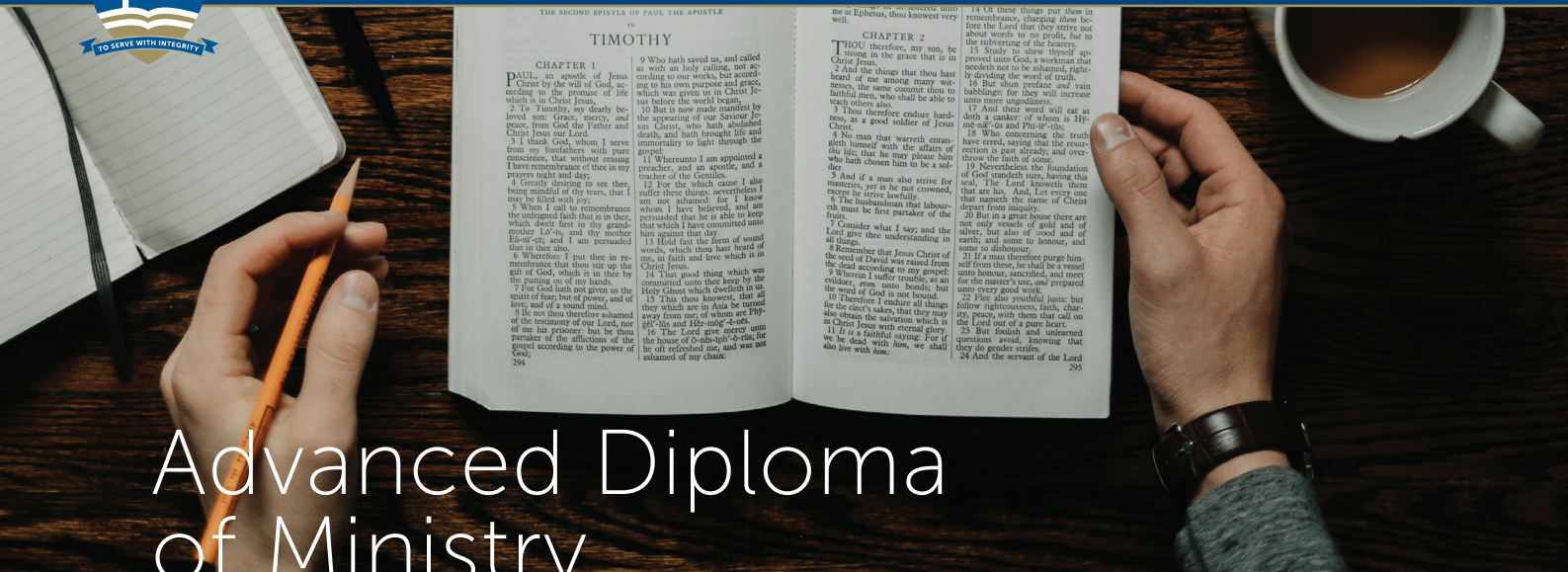

This Advanced Diploma is designed for students who wish for more than just a foundational knowledge of the Bible, and who desire to be involved in Christian service at some level.

Together with a thorough grounding in the Scriptures and a basic knowledge of theology, this course also equips students to be effective workers within the local church or other Christian ministries. Students may specialise in one of the ministry streams offered.

COURSE DURATION AND STRUCTURE

The course is 3 years full time and a maximum of 10 years part-time. The course structure is based on 6 semesters (each 15 week duration), with 4 units taught in each semester. It comprises 8 first year core units, a study skills unit, 8 core second and third year units, 4 ministry specialisation units, 2 field placement capstone units and 2 elective units. The Bachelor of Counselling is a comprehensive biblically grounded and practically driven counselling course which equips students to bring significant and tangible change to the individual lives of those entrusted into their care.

By integrating biblical theology, psychology and counselling theory and practices, students will gain confidence in their ability to effectively facilitate transformation, enabling clients to work through challenging life issues in a relationally-centred way. In understanding the various complexities which impact a diverse range of people, students will be professionally equipped to counsel clients holistically by engaging social, emotional, mental, spiritual and cultural needs in light of the gospel.

COURSE DURATION AND STRUCTURE

The course is 3 years full time and a maximum of 10 years part-time. The course structure is based on 6 semesters (each 15 week duration), 4 units taught in each semester, with a total of 24 units. It comprises of 16 core units, and 6 counselling electives. Upon course completion, graduates are eligible to become registered counsellors with the Australian Counselling Association (ACA). This could lead to a career in professional or pastoral counselling.

Graduate Diploma of Ministry

The Graduate Diploma of Ministry course is designed to enable students who already have a Bachelor Degree in a non-theological field to study at postgraduate level and gain a solid theological and practical foundation for Christian service.

The course also allows students to focus their training in any of the specialisation areas offered, enabling the student to tailor their Graduate Diploma in a direction to suit their particular vocational or ministry needs. As such it is ideal for professionals, who already have an undergraduate degree and require theological, biblical, counselling, chaplaincy, pastoral, or other specialist training at post-graduate level.

COURSE DURATION AND STRUCTURE

The course is 1 year full time and a maximum of 4 years part-time. The course structure is based on two semesters (each 15 week duration), with four units taught in each semester. It comprises 6 core units and 2 ministry elective units. Each unit carries 3 credit points and graduates require a total of 24 credit points to successfully complete the course.

Master of Arts

The Master of Arts course is designed for those who hold a tertiary qualification in a theological discipline who wish to pursue a further qualification in theology as part of their continuing education for ministry.

Students will gain specialised knowledge and skills for research, professional practice and for further learning through completing the Master of Arts program. The course will enable students to acquire an integrated understanding of an advanced field and equip students with the ability to apply such knowledge and skills in a theologically-related area.

COURSE DURATION AND STRUCTURE

The course is 1 year full time and a maximum of 3 years part-time for Category 1 entrants who have completed a Graduate Diploma award in the discipline area of theology. The course structure is based on 2 semesters (Each 15 week duration), with 4 units taught in each semester. Category 2 entrants who have completed a bachelor award or equivalent in the discipline of theology are required to study a maximum of 1.5 years full time or 4.5 years part-time. The course structure is based on 3 semesters (Each 15 week duration), with 4 units taught in each semester. The course may be taken with or without a specialisation. A specialisation in the MA comprises 54 credit points in a Discipline with at least two 9000 series units.

The Master of Divinity course is designed for those who hold a tertiary qualification in a non-theological discipline, who seek a comprehensive education in theology and the opportunity to partake in in-depth theological research; and is for those who hold a tertiary qualification in a theological discipline who wish to pursue a graduate qualification in theology as part of their continuing ministerial education.

Graduates will be equipped with expert, specialised cognitive and technical skills in a theological field through developing their understanding and knowledge in a variety of theologically related discipline areas.

COURSE DURATION AND STRUCTURE

The course is 3 year full time and a maximum of 9 years part-time. The course structure is based on 6 semesters (Each 15 week duration), with 4 units taught in each semester. Each unit carries 9 credit points and graduates require a total of 216 credit points to successfully complete the course.

The Master of Theology is a coursework program designed for those who hold at least a Bachelor of Theology (or equivalent); and who wish to pursue theological studies in greater depth by preparing them for independent postgraduate research at Doctorate level.

Graduates will have advanced knowledge and skills in relation to theology and its related disciplines, enabling them to undertake research, to engage in professional practice, and to continue life-long learning. Students are enabled to develop a deep and integrated understanding of an advanced body of knowledge in either one or more theologically related disciplines with a solid grasp of recent developments in those sub-disciplines.

COURSE DURATION AND STRUCTURE

The course is 1.5 years full time and a maximum of 4.5 years part-time. The course structure is based on 3 semesters (Each 15 week duration), with 4 units taught in each semester. Each unit carries 9 credit points and graduates require a total of 108 credit points including either a discipline or subdiscipline specialisation of 6 units, or in-depth studies of three units in two disciplines or subdisciplines to successfully complete the course.units.

The Counselling stream strongly emphasises developing a Biblical framework for thinking through deeper more intimate relationships between people and between people and their God. Students are involved in practical group work for the acquisition of skills and experience, while pursuing the character required to be a giver of wise counsel.

Students who specialise in the Cross-Cultural Missions stream will be equipped to serve the Lord in a variety of cross-cultural situations. Admissions - Academic

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS - ALL COURSES

All students must be 17 years old or above to enrol.

DIPLOMA COURSE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Every candidate must either:

- Have completed Year 12 in the Australian school system or equivalent within the past 2 years;
- Have completed an AQF Level 4 qualification or higher in Australia (e.g. Cert IV or above in any field);
- Qualify for admission as a mature age student by obtaining a satisfactory grade in both the Written English (at least 130) and Multiple Choice (at least 125) sections of the Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT) conducted by the Tertiary Institutions Service Centre Inc. within the past 2 years; or
- Qualify for Provisional Admission as per s. 4.5 of this Policy.

ADVANCED DIPLOMA ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Every candidate must either:

- Have completed Year 12 in the Australian school system or equivalent with an ATAR of 50 or equivalent within the past 2 years;
- Have other acceptable post-secondary qualifications completed in Australia (e.g., any VET Diploma, PBC Diploma of Ministry); or
- Qualify for admission as a mature age student by obtaining a satisfactory grade in both the Written English (at least 130) and Multiple Choice (at least 125) sections of the Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT) conducted by the Tertiary Institutions Service Centre Inc. within the past 2 years.

BACHELOR COURSE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Every candidate must either:

- Have completed Year 12 in the Australian school system or equivalent with an ATAR of 70 or equivalent within the past 2 years;
- Have other acceptable post-secondary qualifications (e.g., PBC Diploma of Ministry with credit average); or
- Qualify for admission as a mature age student by obtaining a satisfactory grade in both the Written English (at least 140) and Multiple Choice (at least 135) sections of the Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT) conducted by the Tertiary Institutions Service Centre Inc. within the past 2 years.

GRADUATE DIPLOMA ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Every candidate must:

- Successfully completed an AQF Level 7 award (i.e. a Bachelor) in any field apart from theology or ministry.

Admissions - English

ENGLISH ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Students who have not completed studies within the Australian school system are required to demonstrate proficiency in English through completing an IELTS (International English Language Testing System) or through the following alternatives:

- At least five years of study in Australia, Canada, New Zealand, Republic of Ireland, South Africa, United Kingdom or United States,
- Successful completion in Australia of a foundation course, Senior Secondary Certificate of Education or higher level qualification, from the Australian Qualifications Framework within two years of your application date.

The IELTS band scores required are:

Diploma students must demonstrate a proficiency which is equivalent to an academic IELTS band of 6.0 overall and in reading and writing subset.

Advanced Diploma students must demonstrate a proficiency which is equivalent to an academic IELTS band of 6.0 overall and in reading and writing subset.

Bachelor students must demonstrate a proficiency which is equivalent to an academic IELTS band of 6.5 overall (with a minimum of 6.0 in each subset).

Graduate Diploma students must demonstrate a proficiency which is equivalent to an academic IELTS band of 7.0 overall (with a minimum of 6.5 in each subset).

Masters students must demonstrate a proficiency which is equivalent to an academic IELTS band of 7.0 overall

Admissions - Acceptance

ACCEPTANCE PROCEDURE

When we receive your completed application we will do the following:

- 1 Reply to you letting you know we have received your application.
- 2 Write to the two people you have listed and obtain references from them.
- 3 When we have received the references and all required documentation, your application will be considered for approval.
- 4 We will then immediately write and inform you of the decision of the Faculty. Students are notified of the decision within 30 days of a completed application (which includes all references).

All successful applicants who are allocated accommodation on campus should contact the College as soon as possible and make the necessary arrangements for their arrival.

RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING

In some cases students may already have qualifications which can be given credit toward the completion of the course they wish to take. In these cases "Advanced Standing," in recognition of the prior learning, will be given. The Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) form will need to be submitted with supportive documentation at the point of application. Notification, in writing, will be issued by the college regarding the impact of RPL on course duration, and the units to be completed in order to graduate.

Admissions - Spiritual/Finance

PERSONAL AND SPIRITUAL REQUIREMENTS

Students will be required to meet the following criteria:

- 1 Confess their faith in Christ in accordance with the PBC Statement of Faith.
- 2 Be involved regularly in a local church.
- 3 Demonstrate a desire to be involved in church ministry.
- 4 Demonstrate physical and psychological capacity for studying in a tertiary institution.
- 5 Agree to abide by PBC policies and procedures including the student code of conduct.

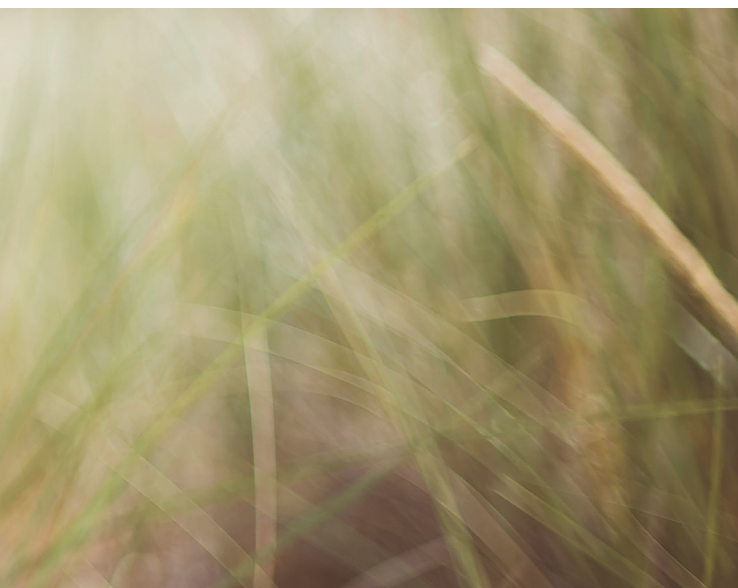
FINANCE

Often students feel that unless they have saved a lot of money before coming to college, they will not be able to afford the studies. Perth Bible College, while maintaining its reputation as a leading Christian educational institution, is, nevertheless, able to provide students with affordable training. Furthermore, PBC is an approved Higher Education Provider. This means that all Australian students may be eligible for the following assistance:

Fee Help – A government funded loan scheme which covers tuition fees for all of our accredited Higher Education courses.

Youth Allowance & Austudy Assistance – An allowance to help with living expenses for full-time students.

Subsidies – Students are able to apply for a student work contract. This enables students to subsidise their fees in exchange for performing certain cleaning, library, or maintenance duties around the campus.





Student Life - Study

WORK LOAD

Undergraduate Studies: The curriculum is designed to ensure that a fair balance is achieved between the study loads of the various subjects. In order to ensure this each subject is broken up into contact hours, that is - the time students spend in class. A standard load for a full-time student is 10 contact hours (4X3hr subjects) per week. Class contact plus revision and assignments will combine to average about 38 hours per week. Students must undertake at least 7.5 contact hours a week to maintain full-time status.

Postgraduate Studies: The postgraduate curriculum is designed to ensure that a fair balance is achieved between the study loads of the various subjects. In order to ensure this each subject is broken up into contact hours, that is - the time students spend in class. A standard weekly load for a full-time student may be 12-16 contact hours per semester. For each contact hour students are expected to do a minimum of 3 hours extra per week for research, assignments, revision and reading.

Community Involvement: As part of our commitment to community life and formation, all students are encouraged to actively engage in the community life at PBC where possible. Throughout each semester students are encouraged to join staff and students for scheduled lunches, devotions and various community events held by the college.

TEACHING

Various forms of teaching methods are used by the College Staff. Students are, however, expected to come to class fully prepared in order to facilitate classroom interaction. Staff members are always available for consultation on study and ministry matters.

Student Life - Ministry

MINISTRY DEVELOPMENT

As Perth Bible College has a strong emphasis towards preparing people for Christian ministry all courses are designed to both develop practical and spiritual ministry skills as well as engage students with real world contexts and ministries. Some of the latter occurs through the college community environment where students have different opportunities to contribute. Other parts of experiencing real world context and ministries involves students being engaged with different church and para-church ministry opportunities.

Students will need to continue to be actively and regularly involved at a local church and find current leaders who can commit to supporting and encouraging them in their studies and help them find opportunities, where required, to engage with ministry contexts. Students are encouraged to, over time, develop a close relationship with the leader they nominate so they are able to provide support, guidance and encouragement not just while they study, but as they continue on a life of ministry.

Perth Bible College believes that it is through the combination of studies and ongoing and increasing exposure to real world ministry contexts that students are best equipped to transition into ministry roles. Studying at Perth Bible College provides an excellent opportunity to put the learning into practice and develop both the skills and transformation that can sustain a lifelong ministry for God.



Student Life - Support

PASTORAL SUPPORT

All students at PBC have access to receive pastoral care throughout the duration of their studies. Led by the Dean of Students, the Pastoral Care team at PBC includes but is not limited to the Dean of Students, the Dean of Counselling, the Dean of Studies and the College Administrator. All members of staff and faculty are also available to provide pastoral support to students where required. Pastoral care at PBC is a service which is tailored to the individual needs of the student.

The Student Council also seeks to ensure the welfare of each of the students. The Student Council are responsible for College activities and resolution of student difficulties and conflict. For Pastoral Support please contact reception to see a member of our pastoral care team.

ORIENTATION

During this time students are introduced to each other, the College and the course.

STUDY READY

The College offers a unit called Study Ready which students may elect to take should they require assistance in their academic study. Additionally, tutoring sessions are made available to all students.



Student Life - Academic Calendar

ACADEMIC CALENDAR

At Perth Bible College all courses are offered via our flexible learning program, allowing students to decide how they would like to study. In February and August students can enrol to study via classroom-based learning, or via live stream classes from the comfort of their own home. In March, late-August and November students can enroll to study flexibly with the support of tutors. Some subjects may also include the opportunity for local flexible learning students to come together for face to face intensives. All semesters run for 15 weeks which include 13 weeks of classes, 1 study week and 1 exam week.

Each classroom-based semester has a two-week mid-semester break, with a four-week break in between the two semesters. These breaks coincide with the Western Australian school holidays.

All classes are held on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, leaving the rest of the week for study, family, or work commitments.

International Mission Teams

IMT is a mission initiative of Perth Bible College. PBC, since 1928, has had a heart for mission and ministry, this continues to today. IMT now forms a regular part of the practical outworking of this heart for mission. The vision of IMT is:

To partner with, encourage, and build up under-resourced networks of Christian leaders across the world.

In many lands and contexts, especially the under-resourced rural and regional areas of the developing world, there exists neither opportunity nor ongoing support to ensure the continual strengthening of the churches that were planted. As one pastor from South Sudan puts it: "The missionaries have told us about the gospel and we believed. But they never told us what it means to be a mature Christian."

This leaves those people and churches open to becoming weak, syncretistic, affected by heresy, or completely side-tracked by cults or other religions. We believe the missional partnering approach of identifying key network relationships, identifying and addressing particular training and development needs, and of sending training teams, short term yet regularly, is one of the most effective ways of strengthening the churches and facilitating a deep genuine indigenous response. In essence it is: Short Term Mission with Long Term Vision. Investing in partnerships and leaders ensures the growth of the churches and is one of the most effective ways of impacting an entire community for Christ. What is learned by the leaders is readily passed on to all. In other words:

Fees include library usage, but do not include textbooks and retreat (\$200) etc. The spouse of a full-time student receives a 50% discount on their course fees. You can audit courses (not be assessed) for a reduced fee.

Work Contracts: Students are able to apply for a student work contract. This enables students to subsidise their fees by performing certain cleaning, library, or maintenance duties around the campus.

Typically this would help subsidise a student's fees by around \$750 per semester.

Fee-Help: Fee-Help is a government loan scheme for Australian Citizens who are enrolled in a private higher education institution which does not receive commonwealth government funding. All courses at Perth Bible College are Fee-Help approved.

* The following year's fees will be released in October.

Finances - Fee Payments

STUDENT FEES

Fees can be paid in the following ways:

- Through the government FEE-HELP scheme. Through FEE-HELP, students are able to have the government fund their fees now (maximum lifetime amount is outlined in the FEE-HELP brochure) and repay the government once their taxable income exceeds the minimum threshold for repayment. CAMPUS

Perth Bible College is situated on the corner of Karrinyup Road and Marmion Avenue, Karrinyup, Perth. It is easily accessible by train, bus and car. The campus is surrounded by beautifully landscaped gardens and provides an attractive, spacious and functional educational complex, as well as modern comfortable residential facilities for students and staff.

ACCOMMODATION

The College provides accommodation for both families and single students, in one, two or three bedroom units. All units can be rented furnished, including a washing machine, refrigerator, cooking facilities, beds, lounge furniture, built-in wardrobes and study desk. Students, however, need to provide their own bedding and personal items.

To apply for accommodation you may either download an application form from the PBC website or contact the PBC office. Accommodation fills up fast so apply early to avoid disappointment otherwise you will be able to be placed on our waiting list.

MEALS

The College provides refreshments at morning tea, as well as lunch three times a week, for all students. Lunches are served in our College dining room and provide an ideal opportunity for students and staff to mix together informally.

TECHNOLOGY

The College has a study room where students can avail themselves of computers for word-processing. The College provides a wireless internet service and all library computers are also connected to the internet and are available for students to use. Students also have the opportunity to use audio-visual equipment and data projectors for presentations and training sessions.

LIBRARY

The library is well stocked with well over 25,000 books and has online resources available. Here students will find all the required material - and more - for in-depth study and research on all topics covered in the syllabus.

A wide range of periodicals and journals keep students abreast of all the latest theological developments, Biblical research, and creative concepts for communicating the gospel more effectively. Many journals are now available to library members on-line. The library also contains a large reference section which incorporates Bible commentaries, Bible versions, concordances, dictionaries, encyclopaedias, maps and other study aids.

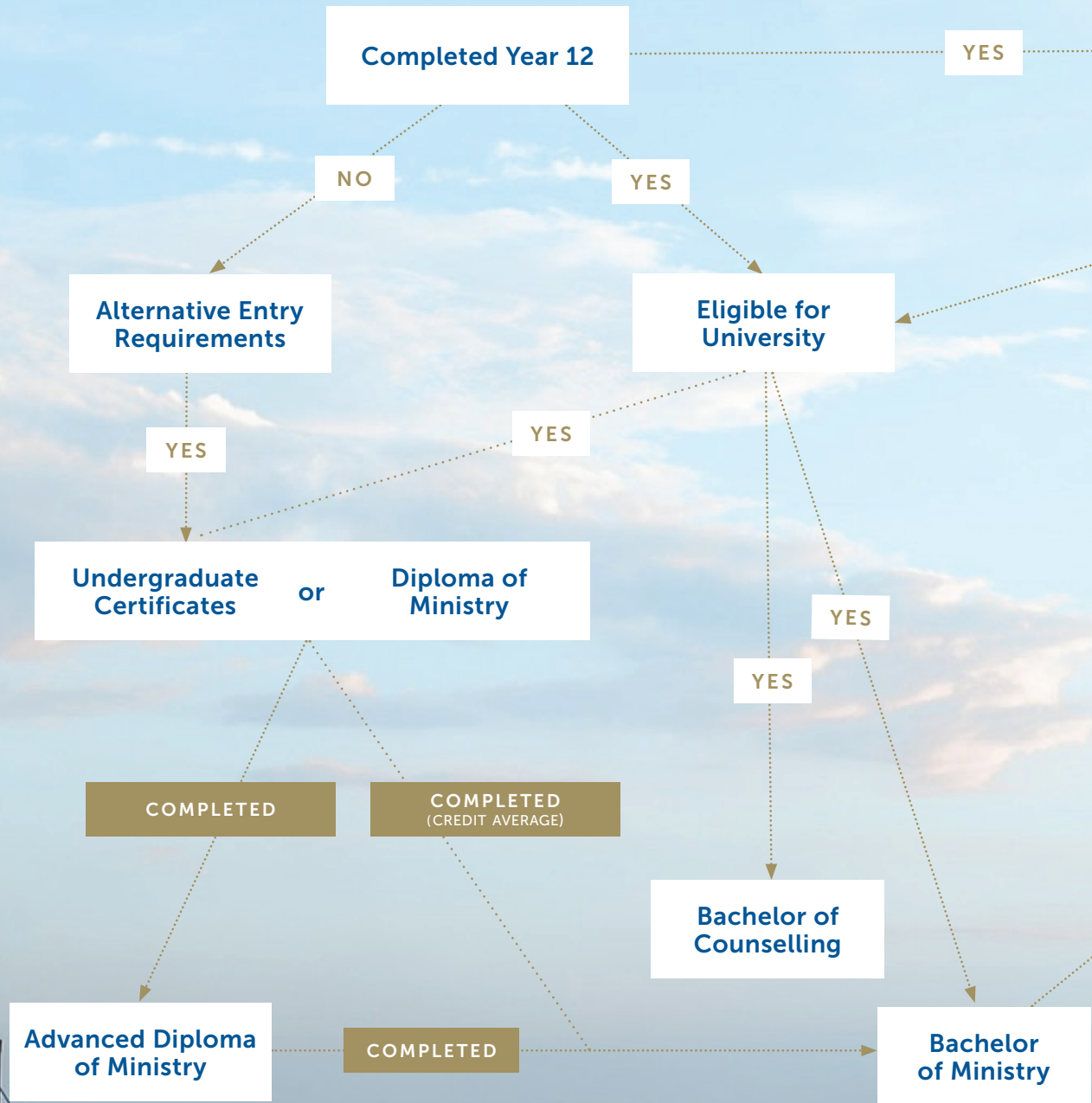
MRS DEBBIE ALLBURY

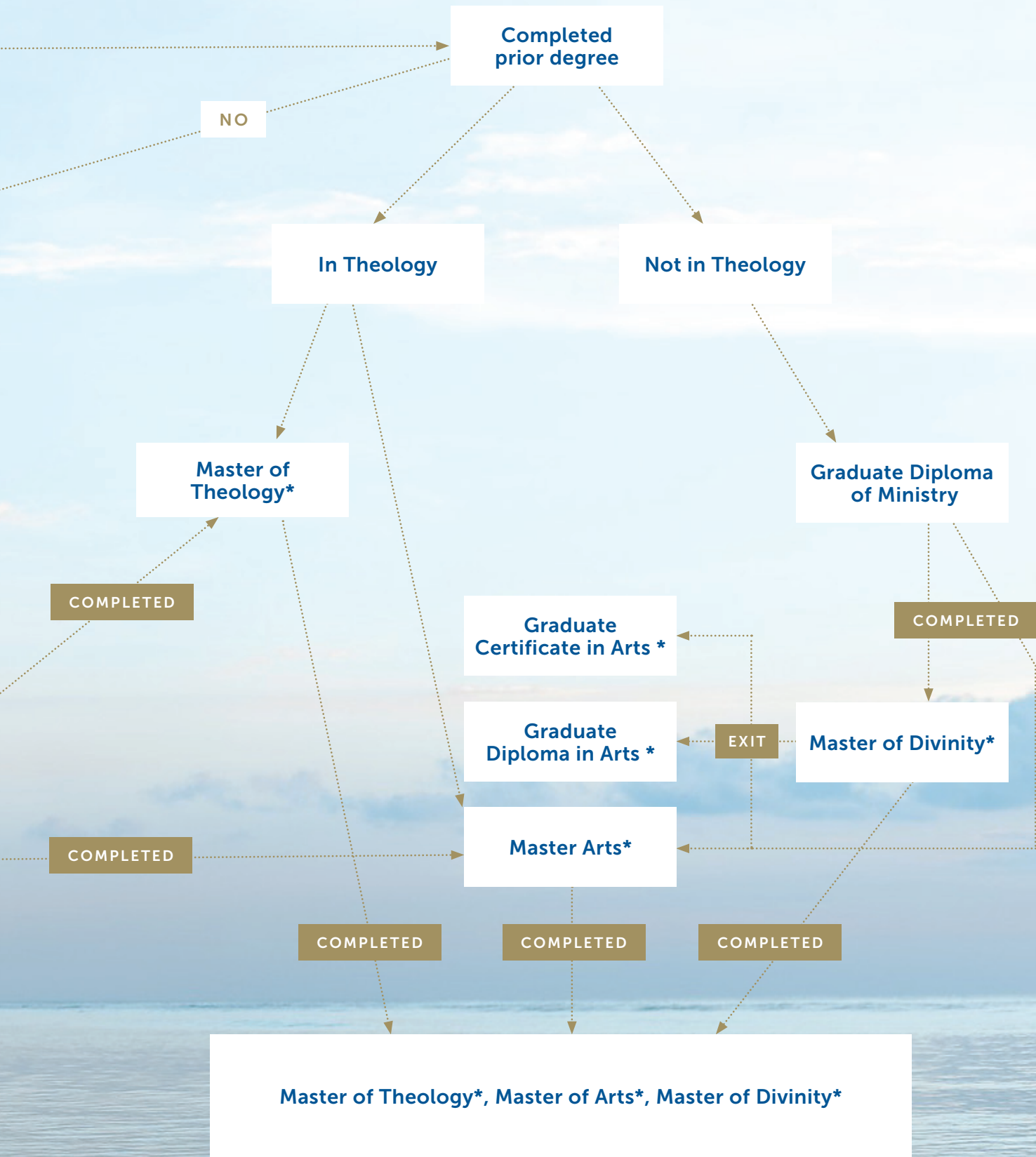
Receptionist
